- **Choose** any age and level appropriate informational book of nonfiction. The purpose of informational reading is to convey information about the natural or social world.
- It is usually organized by topic rather than by the structure of a story.
- It may include boldface, headings, graphics, realistic illustrations, captions, diagrams.
- Do not read biography or autobiography
- Read the book and prepare to discuss it or write about it the first day of school.
- Bring the book to your English class on the first day of school.
